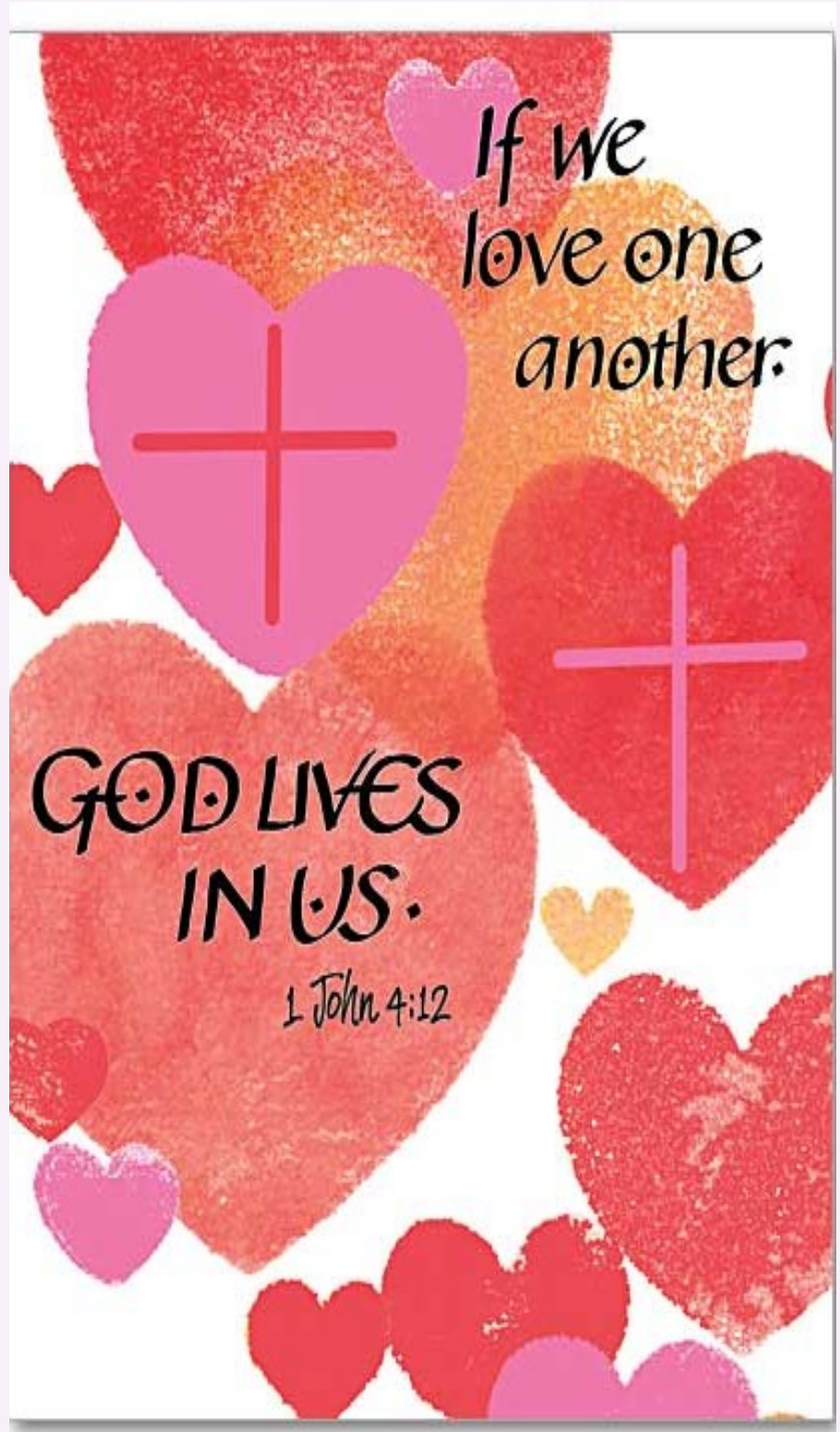

From Pastor Hansen

"As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the sea-- for they were fishermen. ¹⁷ And Jesus said to them, "Follow me and I will make you fish for people." ¹⁸ And immediately they left their nets and followed him. ¹⁹ As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. ²⁰ Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him." (Mark 1:16-20)

Dear Friends,

Mark is such an interesting gospel. It is the earliest of all of the gospels and the writer is not interested in a bunch of stories that do not get quickly to the ultimate story, which is a crucified and risen Jesus for the world. God is indeed doing a new thing. There is a sense of urgency throughout the gospel. Jesus always seems to be on the move. There isn't much time to wait and consider all of the options.

In the passage above in which Jesus calls his disciples, you will note twice the writer uses the word immediately. It is a timing word. It is a word that has some force to it. Immediately is the word that can make the hairs on the back of your neck stand up, like when your mother tells you to go and clean your room, now! The demand isn't subject to you weighing the costs of cleaning or not cleaning your room, nor about when you will do it. It is now. That is the force of this term immediately.

So what makes this term important in this text and in this gospel? Being called to follow Jesus is not something that we Lutherans think much about. We like to think back to our calling in the waters of our baptisms, where God has claimed us and called us to be his children. Following Jesus has been, for most of us, a lifetime call. God has chosen to work through fallible human beings to bring about understanding and fulfillment. Our parents and sponsors brought us to the font and promised to raise us in the faith. They promised to teach us about what it meant to follow this Jesus by teaching us the Lord's Prayer, the Creeds and the Ten Commandments. They promised to bring us to church where we could continue to grow in the faith and learn what it means to follow Jesus. There might not seem to be much urgency in this picture, is there? I mean, we've got a lifetime, don't we? And yet, I wonder how much we understand what it means to hear Jesus' call to follow? If Jesus walked by your office cubicle, or your classroom, your living room, or your place of business, and called you to follow him now, what would you do?

You might think this is an unfair question. You might think of all kinds of good reasons why you might like to think about the call for a while. And yet, I am not sure that any of our good reasons take us off the hook. As we move into the season of Epiphany

it is a good time to look around and rediscover Jesus' call to us. From the waters of our baptisms throughout our lifetime, his call continues. Follow me.

How do you respond? Is the call to follow Jesus enticing enough for you to drop what you are doing and follow? Can you look around you and see the power of God reaching out to you, through you, that others might be loved and cared for? It might help to remember who is doing the calling too.

Following Jesus does not guarantee a worry-free life. In fact, it might lead to more pain and suffering as you stand with those on the fringe of society and walk with those who are hurting. Following Jesus might mean that you put to death those things that draw you away from God—the hesitancy, the considerations, the “weighing of the facts.” It might mean that your life gets reorganized. Operating out of a Christ-centered heart might just free you up to see the world and your life in a new way. I wonder if Simon Peter, Andrew, James, and John had little epiphanies as they were confronted by Jesus that day. Could they see something in Jesus that allowed them to trust his call? I suspect that that trust is what allowed them to simply drop the nets and follow.

While this story might seem far-fetched for us, I wonder if we miss little epiphanies all the time because we don't want to see them. We often choose to keep our eyes closed because we are afraid of what we might see.

My Epiphany prayer for us this season is that we might keep our eyes open and be aware of God's presence in the midst of our life journey—where we work, play, and worship. Where is God calling you to follow? How might you discover life anew?

This Year: A Longer Short “Green” Season

Here are some words about the time after Epiphany from Sundays and Seasons for 2019: “The time after Epiphany is the shorter of the two “green” seasons of the liturgical year that are noted by their location “after” a particular festival (the other is the time after Pentecost). With the joy and excitement of the Christmas season, some may view this time as a low note in the liturgical cycle, just filler until the season of Lent appears. Yet this time after Epiphany serves an important role in continuing what was introduced during the Christmas season, focusing on the means through which God is made manifest in the world in Jesus Christ. Christ continues to be made known to the world throughout the lectionary readings. Each Sunday worshipers glimpse again the totality of Christ through the readings, hymnody, embodied ritual, and fellowship. Each Sunday Christ makes himself known through the bread and wine of the Lord’s supper. Christ also makes himself known in baptism through water and word that claims new daughters and sons.”

This year the time after Epiphany extends through the month of February, with Ash Wednesday not coming until March 6. Last year, in comparison, Ash Wednesday fell on February 14.

Let’s use this longer short “green” season not only to learn about the ways in which Christ was made manifest, but also through our actions to reveal Christ to others.

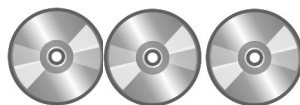

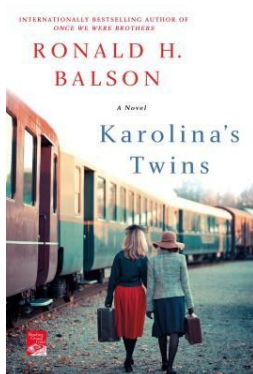

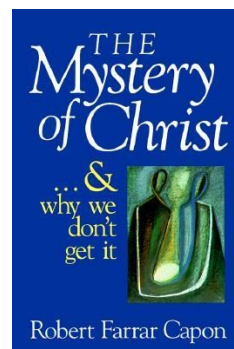
