From Pastor Hecox

Autumn is here!

Sometimes we say “Spring has sprung,” so perhaps now we might say “Fall has fallen?” Haha. When I was a kid, summer was my favorite season, but more recently, I’ve started to find myself favoring autumn.

As you read this newsletter, Autumn has just officially begun. The Autumnal Equinox was on September 22 this year, even though the cool, crisp weather began weeks ago. Memories of soccer on Saturday mornings and fall festivals and markets haunt me every morning when I walk outside.

I imagine you, like me, have had enough of the heat, enough of the humidity, and are eager to welcome the new lightness in the air. I marvel every year at the color of the leaves as they change, as if I’d never seen them before. Which may be instructive for us as people of God as we enter a new season ourselves.

We are entering a new season together in quite a few ways:

- School is back in session
- Sunday School has started up
- Confirmation has commenced
- Choirs are going again
- Wednesday Night Worship has begun
- Thursday Bible Studies are in full swing!

Earth’s seasons are not unlike the seasons of our life. The cycles of work and rest come and go around their prescribed circuits. The rhythms of growth and contraction, excitement and relaxation, mark the moments of our lives in ways that help us make sense of what’s happened to us, what’s happening now to us, and what might happen in the future. They give us a story, a narrative, in which we find a rhythm that can help lend perspective to our lives.

It makes me wonder: what season are you in? Everything is not the same all the time. We are not static creatures, unchanging. No, everything is impermanent, everything is constantly changing, even if it’s changing slowly, imperceptibly. So what season do you find yourself in? A season of dryness, perhaps, or a season of adventure. A season of growth, maybe, or a season of relaxation.

As you consider your own season of life, I have a follow-up question: Where do you sense God’s presence and work around you in this season? We know that God is always with us, always working things together for the good of those that love the Lord. Perhaps that’s happening through a small group you’re part of, like Confirmation or a women’s circle group, or a Bible study or prayer group. Perhaps that’s happening in your prayer closet as you pray for the needs of those around you. Perhaps that’s happening in your reflections on how new realities are being born even now, in this “unprecedented time.”



In this coming year we will begin to enter into a partnership with Parroquia Luterana Santa Maria. This congregation currently worships at Luther Memorial in Madison. They are served by Rev. Kirsten Worzala Dumke and Juan Carlos Cabrera.

From the Quilters

The Quilters report that they were able to pack 39 boxes with a total of 114 quilts, as a first contribution since suspending their quilting efforts during the past two Covid 19 years. A special Thank You to Mary and Alan Meyer for delivering the boxed quilts to the railroad station for the annual boxcar loading, where our quilts were loaded along with approximately 7,000 quilts and care kits from churches throughout south central Wisconsin, all to go to efforts of Lutheran World Relief.



OSLC Members Participate in "Now Is The Time" Study

This past summer, several OSLC members were involved in the study sponsored by the *Synod Racial Equity Ministry Team and the Synodical Women of the ELCA* entitled "*Now Is The Time*." *The study explored the "Declaration of the ELCA to People of African Descent."* *The members taking this study wrestled with the complexity of understanding racism in the United States and in the ELCA as a church.*

The study, completed over Zoom, was held over 5, 2-hour sessions Monday evenings, June through August.

The topics at each session were:

- Now is the Time For Truth-Telling,
- Now is the Time For Understanding the Meaning and Impact of Slavery,
- Now is the Time For Examining Systemic Racism,
- Now is the Time For Realizing and Owning White Supremacy Within the ELCA and
- Now is the Time for Racial Justice, Reconciliation and Reparations.


