

"I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, ⁵ for in every **way** you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind--⁶ just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you--⁷ so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁸ He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. ⁹ God is faithful; by him you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Corinthians 1:4-9)

"In every way..."

It is a curious phrase that is often overlooked in our lives of faith. We often look inwardly towards ourselves. What do I understand about my faith? How do I work to grow in my faith? What if I don't believe just right? Everything seems so ego centered these days. It is certainly not a new thing. That is really what sin is, you know. We lose sight of the one who gives us life in the first place.

We get busy with our lives. We get up in the morning and get on with our routines—jump in the shower, eat some breakfast, off to work or school, or turn on the morning shows and catch up on the news from last night. It is the beginning of routine that guides and rules our lives. We are constantly reminded that we had better not veer off course too much, because we have obligations, you know. We have families to support, mouths to feed, mortgages to pay, credit card bills to pay-off, kids to take care of, diapers to change, and even boredom to get through. Our journeys differ and yet, so often the same. We wonder what difference it makes to be followers of Jesus. How does our faith make a difference when we can't seem to get out of the ruts that guide our lives?

Maybe the answer is too obvious. Maybe it is something we take for granted all too often. We have what we need to grow deep in our faith. It is a promise and it happens through the love of God in Christ Jesus. So, how do we see it? How do we understand how to grow and learn and be fulfilled in our lives?

Maybe it is about starting with the source. Maybe it is about honesty and then it is about hearing the good news that springs forth from the empty tomb that Jesus is raised from the dead. This life of death, this daily grunt of rut living for ourselves as we simply march toward our demise, is not seen as life anymore. We are now free. God has proved his love for us in this good news of Easter. We are free to love God and each other. We are free to look at all of our ruts in a new light of the gospel. This is the good news of Easter, that in every way we are equipped to live our lives in love. May you be strengthened in this love for your Easter journey as we move on our way.

- Most of our meeting was devoted to finalizing the Ministry Site Profile with members of the Call Committee. We thank them for their diligence and look forward to the next phase of the Call process.

Synod Council Journey Part 6—by Debi Peters

Synod Assembly is May 4–5 in Madison. Whether you are a visitor, a voting member or just an interested bystander here is the link to get more information: https://scsw-elca.org/event/2019-synod-assembly/. It is the biggest event of the year. I encourage you to speak to Marcia O'Donnell, Gary Dalgaard, and Nathan Smith about their experience.

Our last Synod Council meeting was on March 9th in conjunction with LEAD. LEAD is the second biggest event of the Synod and this year's keynote speaker was Rev. Dr. Stephen Paul Bouman. His talk on the *Three Roads to Beloved Community* was wonderful. The three roads he described were the Damascus Road, Emmaus Road, and Jericho Road. The following are excerpts from his introduction:

- <u>Damascus Road</u>: On the Damascus Road Paul had a life changing encounter with the Risen Christ. His vocation was formed.
- <u>Emmaus Road</u>: Jesus joined two grieving disciples on the Road to Emmaus. At the table, in the breaking of the bread and sharing of the Word their hearts burned within them and they recognized the resurrected and living Jesus.
- <u>Jericho Road</u>: Jesus tells a story of a Samaritan who served and bound up the wounds of a victim on the Jericho Road.

We are all traveling the same three roads and when we recognize one, two, or all three roads in our daily lives we are living in beloved community. It was a very well received keynote and you may listen to it on the Synod website. Dr. Bauman has started his own consulting business and is available to work with congregations.

One final word about the Synod Council meeting. We did not get through all our agenda items so news about the Strategic Planning must wait until next time.

A Composer in Many Styles and Genres

As part of worship on April 14th, Palm/Passion Sunday, the Senior Choir of Our Savior's will present a Lenten cantata by contemporary composer David von Kampen (b. 1986) based on Paul Gerhardt's hymn *A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth.* Here is more information about David von Kampen.

He is based in Lincoln, Nebraska. His creative work spans a wide variety of genres and styles, including jazz, choral music, hymnody and liturgy, solo voice, chamber music, and musical theater. He holds a Doctor of Musical Arts degree from the University of Kansas, and Master's and Bachelor's degrees from the University of Nebraska.

David has over 60 choral and instrumental compositions and arrangements published by various publishers. His music has been performed by many vocal ensembles, the U.S. Army Blues Jazz Ensemble, and by collegiate, all-state, high school, and church ensembles throughout the United States and internationally.

He is currently a lecturer of music theory and literature at the University of Nebraska, where he directs the UNL Vocal Jazz Ensemble. He also teaches applied composition at Concordia University, Neb., and serves as Music Coordinator for Blended Worship at Christ Lutheran Church in Lincoln. He is active as a conductor and pianist, and as a clinician for vocal and instrumental ensembles.

David sets the melody and text of *A Lamb Goes Uncomplaining Forth* in a way that honors both while adding both nuance and understanding. Kampen's short cantata has seven movements, of which one is instrumental, two are solos for tenor, and four are for chorus.

The Three Days as the Center of the Year

Here, drawing on the writing of Gail Ramshaw and Mons Teig, is some background toward understanding Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil.

In the ancient Mediterranean world, the spring equinox was celebrated as a central religious event. Winter and its threat of starvation were over; plants were coming back to life, night and day were equal. Most religions attest there is no birth without pain, no meal without the death of animals and plants. So some nomadic peoples took the occasion of the hinge between winter and summer to offer to the deities a lamb for their flock. With this perennial gesture of a burnt offering, they expressed their joy at having survived another winter and their hopes for the life of the earth and their own flocks and herds.

The Bible describes Passover as the way the Israelites kept the spring equinox, each household slaughtering a lamb, sharing a festival meal, and recalling that God had saved them from slavery in Egypt. Memory had been layered on top of cosmology.

The Bible says that Jesus was executed at Passover and rose from the dead on the Sunday after the Passover. By the fourth century the observance of this had, for Christians, become a festival of the resurrection spread out over three days beginning with the last supper and foot washing, Jesus' death, and then his resurrection.

The Three Days were seen as one ritual, with only one dismissal, on Easter. Regarded in this way, our worship from Maundy Thursday through Easter becomes more a continual progression toward celebration and less a dwelling on separate events.


Our menu includes: pancakes, scrambled eggs, made-to-order omelets, sausage, bagels, toast, fruit and beverages.

by sharing short sermons during our three worship services on Saturday, April 27th and Sunday, April 28th prior to the confirmation service.




