## Fiscal Matter

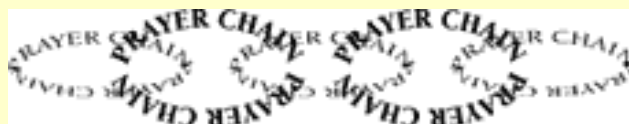

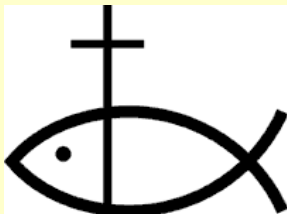


## Built on a Solid Rock Confirmation Heads Up!

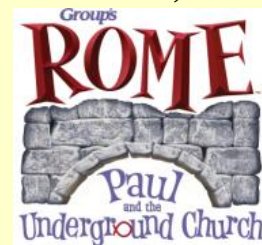
## Family Movie Night

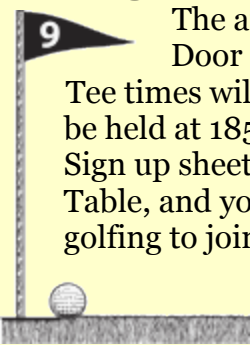

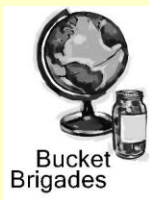
