We have a number of our members who have lost jobs as business has dried up. We have a number of folks whose pension benefits have diminished significantly. We have a number of members whose hours have been cut. We do have people in our faith family who have faced the worst parts of the recession.

I know that loss of income for individuals and families will ripple though to the offering plate. Our organization will feel that pinch when it comes to paying bills, keeping our commitments, and meeting payroll. I believe we have dedicated ourselves to keeping costs to a minimum while still providing excellence in ministry.

And I'm confident that the members of our faith family not severely tested by the present economy will be even more diligent in their support. As a people of God with a common mission we will weather this financial storm.

As we journey through this fiscal whitewater, would you please do several things for me?

1. Knowing that Christ will never abandon his church, pray for our Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, this congregation, and our church leaders.
2. Pray for and support those most affected. Consider ways you can help.
3. If possible, be extra generous in your financial support of the church.
4. Ask the Lord to move within our world to uphold the wavering and to bring stability to our economy.

Let us uplift one another in difficult times. Let us know that God who brought the Israelites out of bondage and through the wilderness will deliver us as well. Let us work hard together to make things better and trust God to make things perfect.

## Annual Meeting Report

The congregation held its annual meeting after services on February 8. The meeting elected Mike Ferris (Vice-President), Gail Niesl (Secretary), Art Fish (Youth & Family Ministry), Shawn Bryant (Public Relations), Helen Feaster (Church in Society), and Bill Rockeman (Finance) to the Congregation Council.

Chuck Cameron, Brett Christensen, Debi Peters and Sue Cowan were elected to join Pastor B. and Pastor Krahn at the synod assembly in June.

Bill Rockeman noted in the treasurer's report that OSLC ended the year 2008 with a surplus of \$17,000, and he explained that some of that was due to not being fully staffed from October through December. Bruce Hutler presented the 2009 budget which included a small increase to most staff members and a decrease in our benevolence gifts to the synod and churchwide organizations.

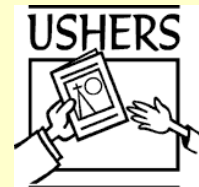
