OSLC members will get a mailing in early November about Gifts from the Heart!, our annual stewardship emphasis.

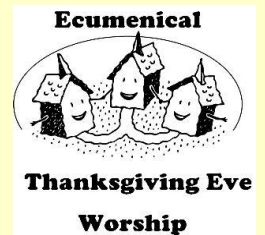

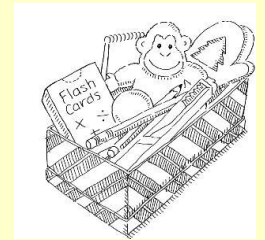


Youth and Family Spirituality Resumes

Rotation 2 – New Challenges – “David”

The 2nd Rotation for children at the O.S. Faith Odyssey is David – The next five weeks we will be exploring the life and story of David. The story of the shepherd boy who becomes king – who would create the messianic legacy that would find its fulfillment in Jesus Christ, yet was a sinful man but never turned away from his faith in God.
