## A Letter from the Pastor

### Hunger has been on my mind lately...

and there are a couple reasons for that.

1. You'll find that I'm regularly hungry just ask the folks in the office.
2. I repeatedly hear how our government (Dane county, state, and federal) has food programs on the chopping block.
3. We will lift up the world's hungry during Bread for the World Sunday and as we raise money for the CROP Walk.
4. The Mission Encounters II theme is Feeding God's Children and we've been starting our team meetings with a hunger fact and prayers for the hungry. Like the following:

The Department of Agriculture released new data showing that 14.5 percent of American families struggled to put food on the table in 2010. The technical term for this is "food insecure." In the world's wealthiest nation, more than 6 million households are food insecure, and more than 16 million children still live in families that

struggle to put food on the table. As so many Americans know, this data shows that the effects of a struggling economy continue to be real and severe.

No matter where you are won't you join in praying for those who find themselves hungry.

### Prayers While Cooking:

Dear God, thank you for this food. May all your people eat so well. Amen.

Dear God, thank you for all these ingredients (*naming each one*). Be present in the cooking and eating of this meal, and be present with all those who have no food today. Show me how my life can be a blessing to them, and lead us all toward that day when no one will suffer hunger anymore. Amen.

### Prayers at the Table:

Holy God, you cause the earth to bring forth an abundance of beautiful and nourishing food. Thank you for your overflowing generosity toward all your creatures. Bless this meal, that it may give strength to our bodies. Remember, O Lord, those whose cooking pots are empty today. Bless them with the knowledge that you are with them and that help is coming. Move the hearts and hands of those who have the power to end hunger, so that kitchens all over the world will be filled with food, laughter, and hope. Amen.

### Prayer While Throwing Out Food:

God, I'm sorry. I took this food and didn't eat it. Please forgive me for wasting food, especially when so many people don't have enough. Starting now, make me wiser and help me take better care of the food you have given me. Amen.

### Breath Prayers: (This type of prayer is especially good while walking, doing household tasks, or working with your hands. Inhale on the first phrase, exhale on the second. Repeat with each breath.)

"Bread of life, Bread of heaven" or "Give us this day, our daily bread"

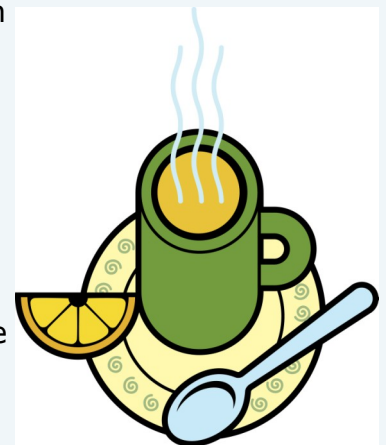
## Fall Healing Services on October 9 and 10

What a great day for the 2011 Rally Sunday! Even though the weather did not allow us to be outside, the bouncy house in the narthex went over very well. Add that to great food, meaningful worship, and the beginning of the educational programs at Our Savior's was very successful! Thank you to all who helped make it a great time. Pre-school registration shows 18 registered for the 10:30 session and 12 for the 9:15 session. The O.S. Faith Odyssey has 154 registered young people, 72 at the 9:15 session and 82 at the 10:30 session. For a grand total of 184 children. The O.S. Faith Odyssey left port to catch up with the "Glory Train" on September 25 and the children have begun visiting

various cars on the train to discuss and learn Christian values. It will be a great time for both children and leaders.

Grow in your faith no matter what your age!

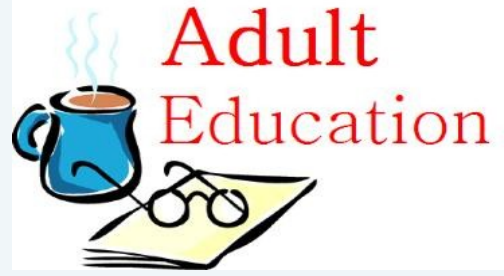
Join one of the following groups!

- **New This Year: Sunday morning drop in Listening Session:**

Bring your coffee and "drop in" to the chapel any or all Sundays for a listening and discussion session. The first five weeks is entitled "Living Islam". Hear voices and stories that embody this faith of over 1.5 billion people and often obscured by violent headlines and unconvincing platitudes. These voices reveal a creative convergence of Islamic spirituality and American identity that is unfolding in the United States. How is the Muslim faith and practice woven into the fabric of modern lives? Learn about the rich and varied insights into the nature and meaning of Muslim identity through the lives and stories of nine different Americans. This session began on Sunday, September 25 at 9:15. Topics on the following Sundays include: "Revealing Ramadan; No More Taking Sides, A new Voice for Islam and Hearing Muslim Voices after 9/11". Beginning November 3 will be "Children of Abraham – understanding the links between Judaism, Islam and Christianity". These two sessions are based on the American Public Media program – Krista Tippett "On Being" and is a public radio's premier conversation about religion, meaning, ethics, and ideas. 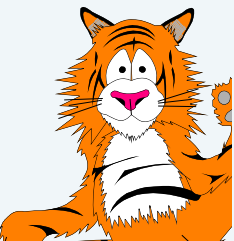
## Middle School Blast Weekend Retreat

## Seminarian Kelly Thompson Update

Greetings from Wartburg Theological Seminary! I can say with confidence that I am well on my way to accelerating the aging or growing process. The race to successful completion of Summer Greek made that abundantly clear. That experience was not only a challenge for classmates and me, but a colossal blessing for us all. In respect to the "aging," yes, a few more hairs are growing loose or gray. And I continue to "age" or "grow" in faith and understanding. Did you know that the Greek word for "loose" also means destroy? My hair was being destroyed? Consider the implications of that in scripture translation.

Fall semester is now in session, and although the full impact of homework has not hit my free time yet, I already sense that the work will not be as stressful as Summer Greek. My favorite class thus far, is "Jesus and the Gospels." The overwhelming theme, permeating throughout all the coursework, is how the gospel has been and is being received differently by different cultures and communities across space and time. I had already grown to be aware of this and have found it affirming. I trust that course exploration and personal growth in regard to the dynamics of the gospel message will continue. However, it is clear that the most common dominator here, in a mortal sense, is community.

In that respect, I would like to thank all those within my immediate community for their support. Without their prayers, personal attention, and assistance, I am certain this path would not be possible. I pray for their continued support moving forward. 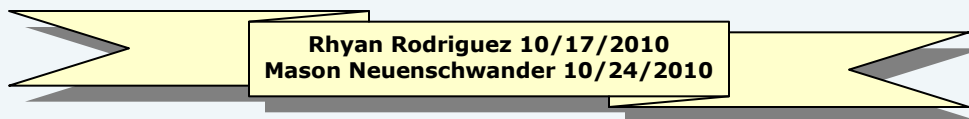
