From Pastor Hansen

⁵ These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: “Do not take a road leading to gentiles, and do not enter a Samaritan town, ⁶ but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷ As you go, proclaim the good news, ‘The kingdom of heaven has come near.’ ⁸ Cure the sick; raise the dead; cleanse those with a skin disease; cast out demons...”

As we begin our move to summer programming around here, we also begin to hear of the ministry of Jesus in our gospel readings for the summer. But we are also reminded in these readings that we don’t just listen to the gospels as if we are detached from them. Rather, we discover early on, as this gospel from Matthew reminds us, that not only are his twelve disciples (servants,) now apostles (ambassadors,) called to follow Jesus, but actually sent forth to bear witness to what Jesus is doing. They are called to be a part of Jesus’ ministry—cure the sick, raise the dead, heal, cast out demons, proclaim the good news of God’s kingdom breaking in on the world. It is not easy to be an apostle for Jesus.

We like to follow, sometimes. We like to think about what our faith means to us. In those moments when we find ourselves in dark valleys, we like to be aware that God is with us. We like to imagine Jesus as our friend. But we are more uncomfortable with being ambassadors for this God. We worry about what others might say. We don’t want to be ridiculed. We let others decide what it means to be a disciple. The problem is that if we let the world define what it means, then it won’t look anything like this sermon from Jesus.

Being a follower of Jesus and an apostle or ambassador is not always easy. What we say and do are often ridiculed by the world around us. And yet, the kingdom is already here as Jesus brings it with him, and will one day come into its fullness. We don’t know when that will be, but it is coming, regardless. Luther says this about that petition of the Lord’s Prayer: “*In fact, God’s kingdom comes on its own without our prayer, but we ask in this prayer that it may also come to us.*”

We often become our own worst enemies as we seek to live our lives with one foot in the world and one in God’s kingdom. Luther would say that it really doesn’t work that way. God’s kingdom is already among us. How you live in this world ought to be informed by God’s overwhelming love and grace and mercy. It might be a simple mantra like, “Love God. Love others.” Trying to live as if we can just keep a toe in the kingdom, takes the purpose out of faith.

This is a big question to ponder.

How you think about this has huge implications for your life. What does your life mean? What is your purpose? What is the legacy that you will leave? How do you want people to know you? These are all a part of that first question.

My hope is that you will spend some time this summer reading more. I hope you reflect on these questions in your devotional life. Grab a cup of coffee with a friend and have some conversation. Call your pastors. Find ways to get involved in our ongoing work of faith at OSLC and see if that nudge you are feeling is the Holy Spirit moving you to a deeper level of faith and wholeness.

As always, I pray for you, and am thankful that I get to walk with you on this journey of faith and pray that God will show God’s love to you throughout your life.

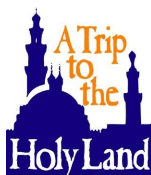

A Call to Justice and Mercy (JAM)



What does God require of you but to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with your God.

Micah 6:8

The Old Testament scripture in Micah captures our need to work towards justice and equity for all people. Our “walking humbly with our God” involves a willingness to learn and grow and be transformed by His word so that we are “doing justice” and “loving kindness.” In the New Testament, Jesus calls his disciples to proclaim the good news to all nations and all people. That good news is about our equality in God and comes with a mandate to treat each other with the same type of justice Jesus showed. In today’s world, that means that the issue of race is an issue of discipleship. “The question is no longer ‘How can I maintain my special and secure status?’ It is ‘How can we grow and change together?’ I think the acceptance of that invitation to solidarity with the larger pain of the world is what it means to be Christian” (Fr. Richard Rohr).

Days for Girls and Hope 2 Others Meet on May 17th

On May 17th the Days for Girls group invited Karen Klemp, founder of Hope 2 Others, to speak to our group about the work she is doing in Tanzania. Hope 2 Others trains midwives in remote areas of the country and teaches life saving breathing techniques. They ship containers of medical supplies and hope to build a clinic and hospital some day.

Coffee Hour Volunteers Needed - June through August

Please consider signing up to help serve coffee, juice, and treats between services. The sign up sheet is on the **Welcome Desk counter**.

If you will need someone experienced to help you, put a checkmark by your name. There are TWO times per Sunday.

The first time is 8:45-9:30 aka Set-Up. During this shift you will need to make sure there are two pots of regular coffee and one half pot of decaf coffee ready to go by 9:00. The creamer, sugar, and coffee cups need to be set out and juice needs to be poured into small plastic cups and typically we need two trays of treats.



The second time slot is 9:30-10:15ish. If more coffee needs to be made you will need to do this, plus continue to put treats out if needed and fill cups of juice. Leave any extra coffee in the urns. **Do Not dump out the coffee.** Around 10:15 start loading the dishwasher and clean up the kitchen area. Before you leave put a dishwasher tablet in the dishwasher, close and push the Normal button.

ANNUAL WISCONSIN ALS WALK FUNDRAISER

Hello OSLC Family and Friends!

With encouragement from Angie Schmidt and Darlene Thorstad, we wanted to invite you to an upcoming fundraiser to raise funds and awareness for ALS, (Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis), also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. This is a progressive neurological disease that results in the death of nerve cells called motor neurons in the brain and spinal cord. These neurons control voluntary muscles. Approximately 5,000 people in the U.S. are diagnosed with ALS each year. At this time there is no known cure, just medications to help slow the progress down.



As you know, Scott was diagnosed with Bulbar ALS in November of 2021. The love and support we have been given from all of you from the very beginning has been overwhelming and amazing. You have been with us every step of the way, so we don't have to go through this journey on our own. All of you have done so much to help us; either with prayers, food, outings, conversations, projects, and time spent together. All of it has helped us more than we can say, and we can't thank you enough.

Last year Scott and I participated in the annual Wisconsin ALS walk. We had a wonderful turnout with so much love and support from our family and friends. We would like to invite you to join us this year! **The ALS walk will be on Saturday, October 21 at the Vilas Park Shelter. Activities start at 9:00 a.m. with the walk starting at 10:00 a.m.** This is a mile walk which is suitable for all ages!

The WI ALS Association is a key component to raise awareness and funds through special fundraisers, such as the Annual ALS Walk, to help defeat ALS. The money raised from these fundraisers helps the ALS Association to discover treatments and a cure for ALS, and to serve, advocate for and empower people affected by ALS to live their lives to the fullest through grants, support groups, equipment loan programs and ALS certified clinics, all which are vital for those living with ALS to live a full, productive life.

The Madison chapter has done so much to help us through this transition and during this past year; from welcoming us in the monthly support groups, to borrowing us equipment for as long as needed, to supporting us through illnesses and advocating for better communication on medications. They truly are with us every step of the way from start to finish, we couldn't do this without them – or all of you!!!

We have set up our team to raise money for the Wisconsin ALS Association. Our team's name is "Every Day's a Blessing." Our goal is to raise \$5000.00 for research and to support our local chapter, (all funds raised at this walk stays with the local Madison chapter).

We know that there are so many worthy causes to support, and each person probably has someone in their life that is touched by a disease.
