## From Pastor Hansen

---

### What Possesses You?

*Then people came out to see what had happened, and when they came to Jesus, they found the man from whom the demons had gone sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed and in his right mind. And they were afraid. 36 Those who had seen it told them how the one who had been possessed by demons had been healed. 37 Then all the people of the surrounding country of the Gerasenes asked Jesus to leave them; for they were seized with great fear. So he got into the boat and returned. (Luke 8:35-37)*

This portion of scripture comes in the story of Jesus healing the man possessed in Gerasene. Gerasene was across the Sea of Galilee from Capernaum. The man who must have had some form of mental illness (named as Legion: a legion was between 5–6 thousand Roman soldiers) had been healed by Jesus and was set free from his bondage to the many voices in his head. The townsfolk had become so afraid of him that they had forced him outside of the town and had him bound and shackled and guarded as a way of avoiding him. As news of his healing comes to the townsfolk, their curiosity gets the best of them and they come out to see for themselves. Finding him in his right mind and fully clothed and sitting at Jesus' feet, the folks discover that they can't take it. They become fearful of Jesus and what he is up to so they ask him to leave. It seems as if it was more comfortable to stay in the status quo than to witness the power of God's kingdom ushered in upon them each day as they saw this man moving in next door. Funny how the story ends, however... While you can imagine his desire was to hang out with Jesus, the one who healed him, Jesus however calls him to go and bear witness to God's work back at home. The very thing the townsfolk were most afraid of happens.

This has me thinking a lot lately.

We live in a world and a culture that is so centered on the me that any upending of the status quo is seen as something to be feared. We like "our Jesus" to pat us on the back and to tell us how good we are. We want a Jesus we can control. We want a Jesus that we can count on to have our backs. What we don't want is a Jesus who goes off and does things that seem out of ordinary. What is this healing all about? A man who had been possessed by demons is freed from their control. The man is free to live into his potential and discover life anew. This man is not only an example of how God's desire for this freedom looks, but is also a witness to how his life is changed. It does not mean that everything will go well. I can't imagine it was easy to move back into town and live among the very people who had you locked in chains outside of town. I can't believe it would have been easy to go out in the town while people stared at you and talked behind your back. And yet, he does what Jesus asks and bears witness to this kind of love that God desires for all of God's creation.

We are a part of a fantastic community of faith. We have programming for people of all ages at Our Savior's. We care about our youngest and oldest among us. We come together regularly for worship—to

## What Does Ministry Look Like at OSLC?

As we continue to grow at Our Savior's, we are looking to also grow the number of people involved in this ministry. While our focus in ministry is about how we grow our faith and the foundation that God establishes in us at our baptisms, our growth shows by how we live that faith out on a daily basis.

One of the ways that we live out that faith is how we are involved in helping others grow their faith by way of the work of the boards at OSLC. Over the course of the next year, each of the boards will offer a newsletter article on the role and the expectations of how their ministry plays a role in the larger ministry of the church. Most of us don't know or understand what or how ministry happens around here so the council committed to this education during the next year. We hope that you may discover ways in which you can grow your faith through volunteerism.

### What Does This Mean?

Pastor Tim is going to be preaching a sermon series this summer based on the Small Catechism by Martin Luther. Each week, Pastor Tim will look at questions that you have raised in conversations regarding faith and life. In many ways these topics are as relevant as ever some 500 years after Luther addressed them in Germany. How can we begin to understand our faith, not in competition with the world around us, but rather as a foundation for all of the things we do and believe and the decisions we make.

confess our turning away and be forgiven as we forgive each other, and receive the sacrament of Christ's presence. We have a variety of Bible Studies that can have an impact on the lives of those who follow Jesus. Our goal is to help each other build up our faith so that we can live into the freedom of being a follower. That freedom of the gospel that Martin Luther used to speak of is a powerful tool for us in our daily struggle against the status quo of the world. Why does the world always seem to win? Why are we constantly possessed by our stuff? Why are we possessed by someone else's dream? Why are we possessed by a certain status of living? Why are we possessed by having to keep our kids from feeling pain or hurt? Why are we worried about keeping them from having to see a counselor every week? Why are we forced to take what is not truth as truth and just live with it?

The ironic healing that Jesus brings in this story is not only for the man among the tombstones, where he was as good as dead, but also to the townsfolk and the witnesses to the story of his healing. In Jesus, God was doing a new thing. This is freedom. As we prepare to celebrate our Independence Day and the freedoms we have now in this country, it may be healing to be reminded of the kingdom of God's role in your life. How does this make a difference in your outlook? How might you discover how to live your life differently—without the shackles?

We are in need of people in this community to step up and become leaders. We are in need of people who can respond to God's holy nudge and step out in faith. In doing so, God will bless us in ways that we cannot even fathom in our own little status quo. So, what's keeping you? Will you accept the freedom God has given you? Will you bear witness to God's work as the healed man in the story from Luke's gospel?

# Christian Education

## UpROAR about the ROAR VBS Program?

You may have heard there has been a lot of buzz recently about the Vacation Bible School Program, Roar published by Group Publishing that takes place in Africa. Articles and social media discuss racially insensitive lessons, specifically, children role playing as slaves, and slave drivers, mimicking the Xhosa language which uses clicks and parodying the Maasai warrior dance, which involves jumping high. In the beginning of June, your Church Staff and VBS Leadership began formulating a specific plan for this curriculum, as they do for the program each year. Alterations are often needed to fit what we believe as ELCA Lutherans or for other logistical requirements.

That being said, the degree of changes needed this year was surprising and honestly, quite disturbing. We found almost a complete rewrite would be necessary. Group, eventually released an apology and update with minor revisions. However, we still feel for a number of reasons, it best to alter our course and switch Vacation Bible School curriculums. We are also exploring options on how we can best choose our VBS program going forward.

There have been many opinions and heated exchanges over the last few weeks on social media. Our duty as ELCA Lutherans is to shine light on instances where the teachings of Jesus' love are in question or misrepresented. Our challenge, mine included, is to not just stop there, but rather to focus on sharing and representing what we do believe and why. As ELCA Lutherans, we view the world through the lens of Christ's unconditional love for us all and the unconditional value Jesus places on us and all people. Please help your Staff and VBS Team share from this viewpoint, as you read and encounter comments and questions about this and other issues.

It is basically a fun "how- to" live out their faith every single day.

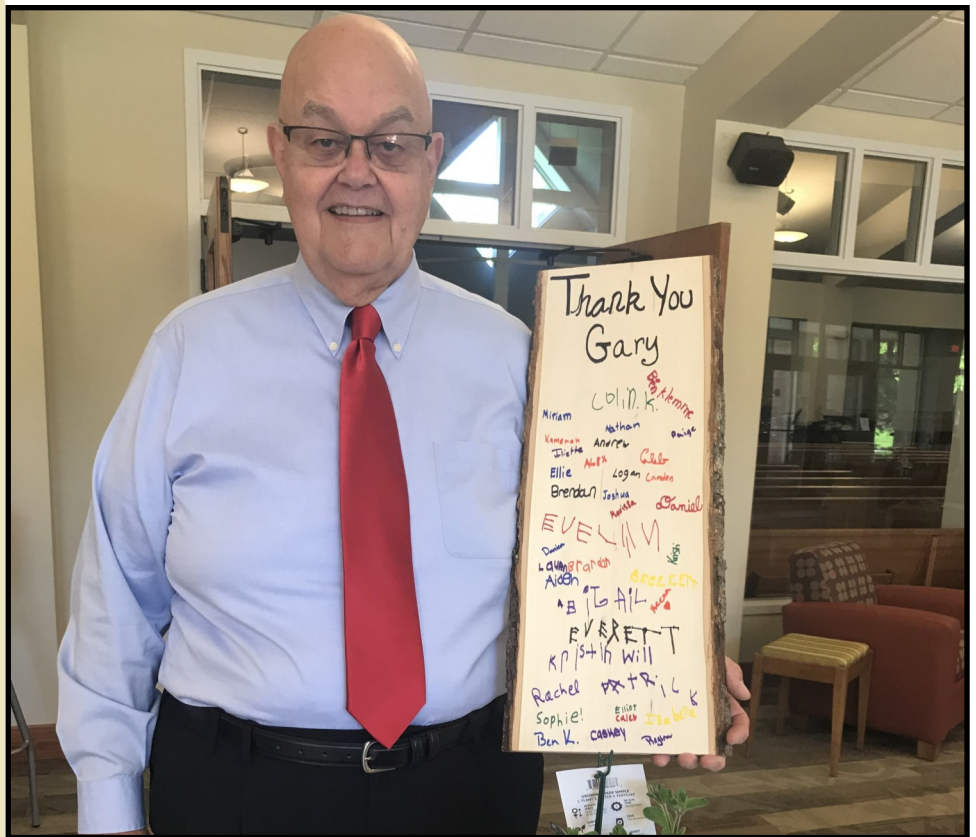
## Baptism Enrichment Class—

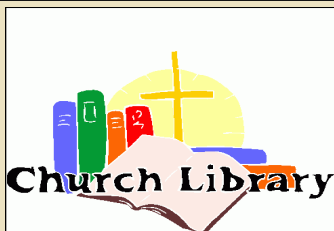

# Youth & Family Ministry

## Youth and Family Board—Who Are We? (by Debi Peters)

The Youth and Family Board is one of 10 Administrative Boards mandated in the OSLC constitution to oversee the church's administration and represent the Board on the Church Council. A complete list of the boards may be found on the OSLC website (<http://www.oslc-elca.org/staff-council>). All the boards are responsible to submit an annual report which may include recommendations for congregational action and/or approval. Each is responsible to initiate and carry out efforts to perform the functions and duties assigned to the Board by the Constitution, By-laws, job description, or a specific resolution of the congregation using the funds set aside in the congregation's annual budget, volunteers, and staff. All Boards must file minutes with the church office that are available to congregation members upon request. Each Board has a volunteer Director who represents the board on the Church Council and ensures regular meetings to discuss current efforts, develop new efforts, and maintain communications related to the Board's functions and duties. I have the privilege of being the current Director for Youth and Family.

The function and duties of the Youth and Family Board, according to the OSLC constitution, is to "involve the young people in the work of Christ, provide for their spiritual growth and nurture, and promote genuine Christian fellowship among the young people of this congregation." That is one big and glorious description which must be broken down. The Board sees its responsibility in the action verbs of this description:

Involve the young people in the work of Christ;  
Provide for their spiritual growth and nurture;  
Promote genuine Christian fellowship among the young people of this congregation.

How any board could meet this expectation without a team of people on the Board and Council is unimaginable. The Board of Youth and Family works closely with the Board of Evangelism, Education and Arts, and Worship. An extensive survey was done under the leadership of Tim McCarthy and Michelle Strobel during 2017 and 2018 to gather input from the congregation about youth and family ministries. 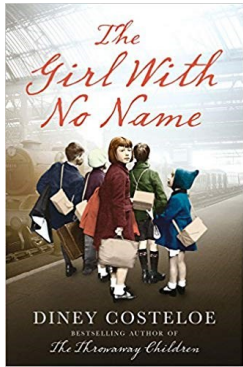

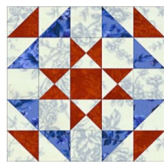
**OSLC Book Club—
