You don't do it alone, but rather you make the journey with a family of faith. Whatever the future brings, we have each other, and a faith that grounds us, and for that we can give thanks!



Coffee Hour Volunteers Needed - May through August

Please consider signing up to help serve coffee, juice, and treats between services. The sign up sheet is on the **Welcome Desk counter**. If you will need someone experienced to help you, put a checkmark by your name.

There are TWO times per Sunday. The first time is 8:45-9:30 aka Set-Up. During this shift you will need to make sure there are two pots of regular coffee and one half pot of decaf coffee ready to go by 9:00. Also, the creamer, sugar, and coffee cups need to be set out. Juice needs to be poured into small plastic cups and typically we need two trays of treats (especially during the school year when there are a lot of Sunday School students in the building).

The second time slot is 9:30-10:15ish. If more coffee needs to be made you will need to do this, plus continue to put treats out if needed and fill cups of juice. Leave any extra coffee in the urns. <u>Do **Not** dump out the coffee.</u> Around 10:15 start loading the dishwasher and clean up the kitchen area. Before you leave put a dishwasher tablet in the dishwasher, close and push the Normal button.

This is a wonderful volunteer opportunity that is appreciated by all.







HOLY LAND 2024

I hope you will join me on a wonderful trip to the Holy Land in April of 2024. I am excited about the itinerary for this trip as it allows us the opportunity to see the sights we have long read about in our Bibles, but even more importantly, to meet those who live out their faith in the Holy Land today.

We will begin in the country of Jordan, where we will be able to see the amazing archaeological site of Jerash, one of the cities of the Decapolis. You will be amazed at the engineering of the amphitheater! We will travel next to Petra and see the land of the Nabateans most recently made famous in the "Indiana Jones" movies. On our way we will stop at Madaba and see a fabulous map of the Holy Land made out of mosaic tile. Following our time there, we will head to Bethlehem. You will have the opportunity to spend time in famous places like Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Nazareth and the Galilee region, including the Golan Heights. A Note from Angie Schmidt's brother, Pete Boll—Raising funds for Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Scenic Shore Bike Tour—July 2023

A short family update for 2023, Jen, the boys, and I are doing well. Ryan is finishing his first year at Metropolitan State University in Denver. Eric (who goes by Ray now) is a freshman at MG21, the local Charter School. Jen is still at the Middle School Library, and I am still at the UW and in the Navy Reserve.



The focus of this year's letter is my brother-in-law, Jon Schmidt. J on is the main reason I've ridden all these years and will continue to ride. On September 18, 2022, Jon succumbed to Mantle Cell Lymphoma after an 8-year battle. His death was a blow and a shock to us all. We love and miss him every day. He had been doing relatively well for so long, but the cancer was too strong, and the doctors just ran out of treatment options. I first met Jon in 1986 when he began dating my sister Angela. They married in 1988. Jon was a great guy, funny, friendly, kind, and always generous. He was always willing to lend advice, and I never heard him deny a favor request. Jon loved his family, friends, and his faith. He and Angie were blessed with 3 terrific boys, Michael, Ben, and Aaron.

Jon was a great dad and tremendously proud and supportive of them all. His last wish was to attend Michael's wedding to Krystina in New Jersey. He was able to do just that about a month before he passed. The time spent and memories made with his family there will be treasured forever.

For the 5th time I'm riding in The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's (LLS) Scenic Shore Bike Tour. I am writing today to ask for your support in my efforts to help LLS *cure blood cancers*. Every dollar I raise leading up to the event will help LLS fund groundbreaking research for cures, provide free patient support, and advocate for the best interests of patients. My team, the Lymphomaniacs, and I will

be 100 strong riding the shore of Lake Michigan on July 22-23, 2023, alongside over 1,000 passionate, cancer fighting athletes. Our team goal is to raise **\$225,000** and my personal goal is to raise **\$10,000** which will go directly to LLS in support of its longstanding goal: a world without blood cancers.

There are many reasons to be proud to support LLS's efforts. For instance, approximately 40% of new cancer therapies approved by the FDA since 2000 were first approved for blood cancer patients. And many of these LLS-supported therapies not only help blood cancer patients but they have also led to a tremendous number of advances in many other types of cancers, like bone, brain, and breast.
