"But Thomas (who was called the Twin), one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. ²⁵ So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." ²⁶ A week later his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." ²⁷ Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." ²⁸ Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" ²⁹ Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe." ³⁰ Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. ³¹ But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name. (John 20:24-31)

I have to admit that there are times when I think that Thomas gets a bad rap from our historical traditions. As noted, in our text for the Second Sunday of Easter, Thomas wasn't with the other disciples in the upper room when Jesus first came to be with them. We are not told why. It can only be idle speculation. Regardless, when he is with them after Jesus has disappeared, Thomas is not so quick to buy into the other disciples' story. He appears to be one who needs something to hang on to before he jumps into the waters of such faith.

It has been our tradition to give him the name, "doubting Thomas." Jesus' second appearance catches Thomas in the room with the others and he seeks Thomas out. The goal, it seems, according to Jesus is that Thomas have faith. Jesus wants Thomas to know that he has arisen. There is great joy in knowing that even death could not hold him and that his resurrection gave hope and promise to all of God's children. "Do not doubt but believe," Jesus says. In many ways I read this story to hear Jesus say to Thomas, "Whatever it takes, Thomas. If you need to put your hands in mine, or touch my side, then do it. Believe!"

I used to think this story was really about avoiding being Thomas. There have been times in my life when I was worried about my doubts. Where was God in the midst of a certain crisis? I remember a time in college when we studied the holocaust for a couple of weeks on campus. It took me several more weeks to work through the impact of that horrific event on my faith.

But what about the times when I have doubt in my own personal life? What about those times when I wonder if the story is really true? What about the times when I wonder what difference it makes in my life today? To somehow say that my faith life, or the value that I have as a Christian is dependent upon a faith life with no doubts leaves me in trouble. To believe that this story is a story about what not to do is to miss the point.

This is a resurrection story! Jesus has arisen! It is a story of celebration of victory! God's promise of faithfulness and salvation breaks through even the last great barrier—death. Jesus is not interested in chastising Thomas, or you or me. Jesus wants us to believe that he has arisen. We can now get on to the question about what that might mean for us today.

Thomas is the first to respond, “My Lord and my God!” Like the Father and his two sons in the parable of the prodigal, the story isn’t really interested in the excuses or the hollow words of the sons, but rather in the extravagant love for his children.

Why is it that we always want to cloud the celebration with our own justification for our own celebrations? After all, the focus on this story is not about Thomas’ ability or “non-ability” to believe what he doesn’t see. The point of this story is that Jesus is willing to go to the mat for us to help us realize the depth of his love. What will it take for you to believe that Jesus is raised from the dead on Easter morning?

Upon believing, what difference might it make in your faith life? How might the news of Easter play a role in your everyday world? This is where life becomes interesting. How might this resurrection story change your everyday focus? How might living in the light of Christ’s resurrection play out at school, at your work, or even in your home? How might this love story change the way you make decisions? What might it mean for this community of faith? “Do not doubt, but believe.”

HOLY LAND 2024

I hope you will join me on a wonderful trip to the Holy Land in April of 2024. I am excited about the itinerary for this trip as it allows us the opportunity to see the sights we have long read about in our Bibles, but even more importantly, to meet those who live out their faith in the Holy Land today.

We will begin in the country of Jordan, where we will be able to see the amazing archaeological site of Jerash, one of the cities of the Decapolis. You will be amazed at the engineering of the amphitheater! We will travel next to Petra and see the land of the Nabateans most recently made famous in the “Indiana Jones” movies. On our way we will stop at Madaba and see a fabulous map of the Holy Land made out of mosaic tile. Following our time there, we will head to Bethlehem. A Note from Angie Schmidt's brother, Pete Boll—Raising funds for Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Scenic Shore Bike Tour—July 2023

A short family update for 2023, Jen, the boys, and I are doing well. Ryan is finishing his first year at Metropolitan State University in Denver. Eric (who goes by Ray now) is a freshman at MG21, the local Charter School. Jen is still at the Middle School Library, and I am still at the UW and in the Navy Reserve.



The focus of this year's letter is my brother-in-law, Jon Schmidt. Jon is the main reason I've ridden all these years and will continue to ride. On September 18, 2022, Jon succumbed to Mantle Cell Lymphoma after an 8-year battle. His death was a blow and a shock to us all. We love and miss him every day. He had been doing relatively well for so long, but the cancer was too strong, and the doctors just ran out of treatment options. I first met Jon in 1986 when he began dating my sister Angela. They married in 1988. Jon was a great guy, funny, friendly, kind, and always generous. He was always willing to lend advice, and I never heard him deny a favor request. Jon loved his family, friends, and his faith. He and Angie were blessed with 3 terrific boys, Michael, Ben, and Aaron.

Jon was a great dad and tremendously proud and supportive of them all. His last wish was to attend Michael's wedding to Krystina in New Jersey. He was able to do just that about a month before he passed. The time spent and memories made with his family there will be treasured forever.

For the 5th time I'm riding in The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's (LLS) Scenic Shore Bike Tour. I am writing today to ask for your support in my efforts to help LLS **cure blood cancers**. Every dollar I raise leading up to the event will help LLS fund groundbreaking research for cures, provide free patient support, and advocate for the best interests of patients. My team, the Lymphomaniacs, and I will be 100 strong riding the shore of Lake Michigan on July 22-23, 2023, alongside over 1,000 passionate, cancer fighting athletes. Our team goal is to raise **\$225,000** and my personal goal is to raise **\$10,000** which will go directly to LLS in support of its longstanding goal: a world without blood cancers.



There are many reasons to be proud to support LLS's efforts. For instance, approximately 40% of new cancer therapies approved by the FDA since 2000 were first approved for blood cancer patients. And many of these LLS-supported therapies not only help blood cancer patients but they have also led to a tremendous number of advances in many other types of cancers, like bone, brain, and breast.
