## From Pastor Hansen

"And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth. From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace."

(John 1:14, 16)

Dear Friends in Christ,

We begin the season of Advent this week and our theme during our Wednesday evening worship is, "Tidings of Comfort and Joy." This is a great idea for a theme as we come into this season in a world that is fraught with fear and anger and discord. Knowing that there are currently wars being fought around the globe, and knowing that it is difficult to sing about peace in the "Little Town of Bethlehem," we still hear these words spoken of a God who brings a new kingdom among us. This kingdom, while not yet fully realized, is a kingdom where peace and love rule. While none of us knows what the future holds for us in our everyday journeys, we are reminded in this season of Advent that we are held by the one who "became flesh and dwelled among us."

This season means different things to different people. For some, there is great anticipation of what is to come. There is the excitement of family and friends gathered at Christmas and the hope that together our family and our world is better. However, we also know that not everyone is ecstatic over this holiday. For many, this season is a painful reminder of loss—whether it be loved ones, or even a loss of a sense of hope in the midst of difficult situations.

One of the more popular Christmas carols is titled, "God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen." I think this Christmas carol speaks to both. Caught in the middle we pray for both—comfort in those moments when we feel most alone and lost, and joy that comes on the other side. Joy isn't about being happy. It is not an emotion that comes and goes depending on how happy we are. But joy comes in knowing who you are and knowing who knows you. It is something that comes into where we are at any given moment with a reminder that we are loved by the same God who reconciled the world to himself—that nothing can separate us from God's love.

On Wednesdays, this Advent season, we will gather in the sanctuary for a short service that will include parts of the Holden Evening Prayer, some lessons, a couple of chosen carols, and then concluding with a Christmas Carol hymn sing. It will be your choice! We begin with a light meal in the Fellowship Hall at 5:15 and then gather for worship at 6:00 and conclude by 6:30 pm. We hope you will take time out of your busy day to come and reflect on what the promise means to you. We hope that you will discover comfort and joy once again!

As we prepare for Jesus' coming once again, let us take some time to ponder what that means in our lives today. Let's take some time to wonder about how we might live in these times. How might we bear witness to Christ's light in our darkness? How might we learn to love another? How might we understand the courage to stand with those

for whom this time is filled with sadness and fear? We are reminded that 2000 years ago, Jesus was born, and the world has never been the same.

Each Winter as the Year Grows Older

By William & Annabeth Gay

Each winter as the year grows older, We each grow older too.
The chill sets in a little colder;
The verities we knew
Seem shaken and untrue.

When race and class cry out for treason, When sirens call for war, They overshout the voice of reason And scream till we ignore All we held dear before.

Yet I believe beyond believing, That life can spring from death: That growth can flower from our grieving; That we can catch our breath And turn transfixed by faith.

So even as the sun is turning To journey to the north, The living flame, in secret burning, Can kindle on the earth And bring God's love to birth.

O Child of ecstasy and sorrows, O Prince of peace and pain, Brighten today's world by tomorrow's, Renew our lives again; Lord Jesus, come and reign!

This Advent Hymn is one of my favorite Advent hymns! The hymn was written by William and Annabeth Gay in 1969. It was written by the couple as a Christmas gift for friends. This hymn expresses the theme of hope in the midst of a world stuck in turmoil. Think back to 1969. We were in the midst of the Viet Nam war, the civil rights movement, a movement to turn away from the reality of the moment. Gay expresses his sense of hope even when things look bleakest. Annabeth takes her husband's words and creates this hauntingly beautiful tune to accompany the poem which deepens the poignancy of his tome. As we sit here today in the middle of a world that seemingly is on fire, once again, I return to this hymn and pray more fervently this hymn, trusting that God will renew us all and lead us to become light bearers in a darkened world. May God bring you needed balm for your journey this month and every day.




