Dear friends at Our Savior's,

As we approach this month of February it is looking like a busy month. The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, which for this year, is on Valentine's Day. I suppose that could seem apropos for the purpose of such a season. During the season of Lent we focus on the breadth and depth of God's love for all of creation in the passion of Jesus. It is a season of the church year where we actually focus some time and energy into exploring this news of the passion and subsequently the good news of Easter morning.

In our world, 40 days seems like an eternity. Our media-focused lives are centered around shortened news cycles and sound bites. This is one of the gifts of this season of Lent. We actually take some time to think together about what it means that God would love us into a right relationship with God.

This year we are going to be using a series of dialogs on Wednesday Lenten services. The series is called: "Overheard: Conversations by the Cross." Here are the introductory comments to the series:

"Do you suppose it is possible that various people who were involved in our Lord's Passion ever had the opportunity to talk with one another about it? Perhaps even right then, while the events were happening? Can you imagine what they might have said? People like:

- Malchus, whose ear was cut off and healed at Gethsemane, and Mark, who ran from the Garden naked.
- Barabbas, the criminal released when Jesus was condemned, and Caiaphas, the high priest who led the cries for his release.
- Pontius Pilate and Procula, his wife.
- Simon of Cyrene, who carried our Lord's cross, and the Centurion who compelled him to.
- The Two Thieves who were crucified with Christ.
- Mary, our Lord's grieving mother, and John, the "beloved disciple," who took her into his home.

If you could have listened to conversations like those, what might you have OVERHEARD?

With piercing insight and dramatic reality, these Lenten services invite us to eavesdrop on the concerns and conflicts of people whose lives were touched ... and changed ... by the crucifixion of Jesus Christ—just as our lives have been."

We hope that you will take some time during this season to ponder what God's love actually means for your daily living. How might this love affect your life? If you could have a conversation with someone else about your own faith experience, what would that sound like?

Thanks for being such a great community of disciples.

Hearts from Bethlehem

Beginning on February 4 you will have the opportunity to purchase a olive wood heart, hand carved in Palestine for \$3.00. There were 8,000 hearts carved to represent the number of children killed in Israel/Palestine since the beginning of this war. They were laid around the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem on December 28th, which is the day commemorating the slaughter of the innocents by King Herod.



By purchasing one of these hearts, you have the opportunity to reflect on the lives of children and families in the Holy Land today, but also to help Palestinian olive wood carvers earn some kind of income for their family. **OSLC has purchased 100 of these hearts and they will be available for purchase beginning Sunday, February 4th.**

Holy Land Trip Postponed

Because of the ongoing war in Israel and Gaza, the Holy Land trip planned for April of 2024 has been postponed to the spring of 2025. We will have updates as the year progresses.

A Call to Justice and Mercy (JAM)

The JAM study group has been reading the book *How the Word is Passed* by Clint Smith, exploring the history of slavery in the United States by examining various historical sites and monuments.

On Sunday, February 18th, at 4:30 p.m., we will be showing the film “12 Years a Slave”, a movie released in 2013, based on the memoir of Solomon Northrup, a free African-American man who was kidnapped and sold into slavery.

Both the book and the movie contribute to a deeper understanding of the impact of slavery on individuals and society, highlighting the need for acknowledging and confronting this dark chapter in history. They shed light on the systemic injustices and enduring legacy of slavery in the United States.

The movie will be shown in the theater and pizza will be served during a break.

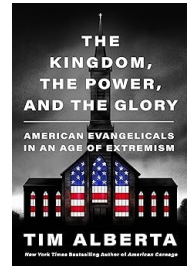

Sunshine Supper

We want to give a big THANK YOU to Paul Thurston for all of his leadership with the Sunshine Suppers throughout the years! Through his leadership and coordination many hungry people were fed in Sun Prairie. Thank you, Paul! We are also excited to have the Men's Squirle take on that leadership of the meal. Thanks go to Tom Schlinder and Steve Olson for coordinating our men's group as we prepare for February 19th. A sign-up for volunteers is located on the welcome desk. If you can help us out, please take a moment to sign up.



Something we have learned in this process is that the number of those benefitting from the suppers has grown immensely. Before Covid, we served an indoor meal to around 100 people. Sometimes it would push to 120-130, but generally that was the limit. Now we are serving over 400. Unfortunately, that means that the costs go up. Last year the cost was over \$5,500. We anticipate it going higher this year. Our donations for the supper were almost \$3,500. Luckily we had money in our dedicated account to help cover the expenses. We are asking the congregation to help us in this vital ministry of feeding the hungry and humbly ask for your monetary donations to this important ministry. Thank you for your partnership!
