From Pastor Hansen

Quick Ears

"Now after they had left, an angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, 'Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him.'"¹⁴ Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt,¹⁵ and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet, 'Out of Egypt I have called my son.'" (Matthew 2:13-15)

"You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger;" (James 1:19)

How did this happen? It seems like we were just dealing with the stewardship drive of the fall and preparing for Seth to arrive and all of a sudden, we are into January. People say this happens with a late Thanksgiving, but I was not prepared for it. It was hard to capture the spirit of Christmas in the rush through to our celebrations of the Nativity. In the midst of the season of Advent were the impeachment hearings in the House of Representatives and the political campaigns for 2020. In all of this there have been lots of words spoken. Speech after speech has come to us via radio, television, internet, twitter and the like. Lots of speaking and maybe not so much listening. When it came time for the vote, there were plenty of speeches that were done for political gain and not so much a debate about the merits of such a vote. Surrounding all of this "Washington speak" are the plethora of voices of support or protest of the current process and events.

I just wish people spent a little more time listening to others before they spoke. I suspect that I ought to be included in this, too. We make up our minds about things based upon hearsay, or what someone we follow on twitter might say and then fire off a tweet or say something in public that is just shameful. There are lots of "non-apologies" offered after that, but the damage has already been done. We find ourselves now in a place where bullying is not only acceptable but encouraged in order to score political points. From the House floor this week came words from a member who compared President Trump to Jesus and said Jesus got a better deal. Somebody else tweeted something about Joe Biden and his stuttering conversation before learning that it was something he had dealt with as a younger child. While a later twitter apology was made, the damage was done.

Our season of Epiphany is upon us already. We hear the news of the Magi's visit to Jesus and the horrific reaction of Herod's paranoia to kill all of the babies under the age of two in order to satisfy this paranoia about a king to usurp his throne. In all of this we are told that Joseph, Mary and Jesus escape to Egypt as refugees. Unfortunately, we live in a world that continues to be a violent and unsafe place for many people who are displaced because of wars and unrest and unsafe living conditions. Such unrest is too often caused by our desire to claim power and to cling to it at all costs. There have been refugees throughout the centuries who flee to other places, away from their homes in hopes of finding safety and security and a dream of a better life. Our country was founded on such principle, notwithstanding the displacement of natives already here.

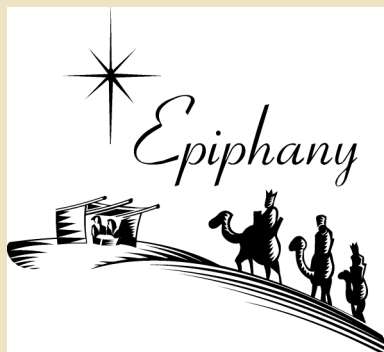

And yet, we hear people who quickly jump to the conclusion that all refugees are bad and scary and should not be welcome here. We hear these diatribes from people who claim to be followers of Jesus—who claim their Christianity like a badge and who have politicized it in a way that would be unthinkable to the Holy Family.

Our Savior's has played a key role in helping with refugee resettlement in the Madison area over these past years, and we would continue to do more if our government would allow refugees to resettle again. The joy of setting up apartments and welcoming these people into our midst was evident not only to the refugee families but to us too.

As we wonder what does it mean to live faithfully into our journey on this earth it might be helpful to listen to James once again, "You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger;" (James 1:19) I think we might bear better witness to a God of love and acceptance; a God who is merciful. May God continue to dwell with you and in you during these days of winter.

Council Notes

- Staff computer upgrades are progressing and we hope to address the phone system early in 2020.
- Property is looking at replacing the two old furnaces that serve the office area and 2nd floor with one unit.
- We have received a nice donation for refitting restrooms with new higher toilets.
- Finance is considering refinancing our building loan. Interest rates are very attractive and it may be a good opportunity to lock in a better long term rate.
- We are actively seeking candidates for Council Vice President and the Board of Evangelism. Please consider these opportunities to serve.
- Our Annual Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday February 9th following the 10:30 worship.
- Shelly Perkolup, Debi Boles and Lisa Hansen are working with Property to identify a space for a "Nursing Nook." While we want to make sure that we are welcoming to mothers that are comfortable nursing in the Sanctuary or Narthex, we want to create a space for nursing mothers who would prefer a more private area. They would love to hear any creative ideas.
- Council is considering revisiting our Visioning Process in 2020. Our five part Vision for Ministry is now four years old and we think it might be a good time to review where we are and refresh our plans. What are our assets, our dreams and our goals?

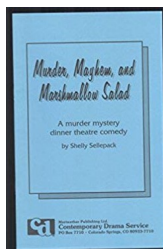

Triangle Community Ministry Shared Table—

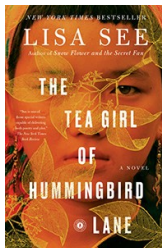
