A Time of Healing and Hope

As we enter February together, lots of things are happening around us.

- * The coldest month of the year gives way to a month almost equally as cold
- Another change in the White House has occurred
- Black History Month begins
- OSLC will continue to evolve as we help each other toward a new future

Because of all these realities (and many more) my main focus has been on healing. Friends in Christ, we are all in need of major healing. That's true not just because of the particularities of our circumstances, but it's true of pretty much all people from all times and all places.

For us, and our particular time and place, we seek healing from physical ailments, from anxieties about the state of the world around, from emotions caused by transitions and unexpected changes. There are many wounds, plenty of anxieties, and some profound emotions within us and around us. So it's not surprising that these days, I'm averaging around twenty meetings a week. Some of those meetings are with groups, but most are with individual members who need to process emotions, work through thoughts, and have a trusted person give them their undivided attention and be truly present with them. Once you factor in the phone calls, the emails, and the texts, it all adds up to dozens of individuals coming to their pastor weekly, seeking comfort and searching for healing and hope.

I'm privileged to walk alongside folks as they've been working through these various emotions. There's a lot of love in this congregation, a lot of kindness and support. It's been wonderful to hear those things expressed, and I have in turn found myself encouraged. I'm happy to say that in a time when external forces may cause chaos, there are many, many people helping each other to find inner peace. The Holy Spirit is at work, and healing is already underway.

Sometimes we can get caught in a cycle of doom caused by fears of the political landscape, or anxieties about climate change or impending war, or surprise at unexpected changes in our own personal or collective lives. I believe in a God who makes a way, even when there seems to be no way. That God provides hope and healing even when we don't always understand how it'll happen. I'm watching it happen now with my own eyes, and I'm hopeful you experience it too, and find yourself lifted up in Christ's caring embrace. My prayer is that you find support and love from us, the body of Christ, acting as his hands and feet

So lift up your hearts, even in the dark and cold. Hold fast to hope and stay focused on Jesus Christ, the author and finisher of our faith and the source of our healing. And may we help each other find healing - and ultimately the joy of the Lord - together. Amen.

Financial Progress Report for December 2024

1) General Fund:

Giving: \$87,755.99 Expenses: \$56,534.72

A Note from OSLC's Treasurer:

The 2024 Giving Budget is \$668,500 and as of December 94% has been raised. The 2024 Expenditure Budget is \$729,300 and as of December 96% has been spent. The Cash Flow was a positive \$31,200 at the end of December and Year-to-date was a negative \$13,000. Mortgage payment this month included \$2,300 in interest and \$11,500 in principal.

Updates from Our Savior's Music Department


I have greatly enjoyed my first month serving as the church's music director and organist while continuing as praise band director. Thank you for your words of encouragement and prayers!

A Call to Justice and Mercy (JAM)



What does God require of you but to do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with your God.

Micah 6:8

We continue our series on the Prison System in Wisconsin. Please join us when you can and/or for all the sessions, if possible. Future dates are February 2, 9, 23, March 2, 9, 16, and 23. We meet in the Chapel. No meeting is scheduled on February 16th to allow your attendance at the Annual Meeting.

On February 9th James Morgan from the group **Madison Organizing in Strength, Equity, and Solidarity** (MOSES) will be our speaker. James spent 24 years in prison and has been a member of MOSES since its beginning. Plan on attending as James lends his voice to the transformative justice call in Dane County and Wisconsin.

As we progress through our 9 weeks we will be having 2 more community speakers. All of these will contribute to our understanding of the prison system with a focus on Wisconsin. Elsewhere in Dane County there will be a re-entry assimilation in April demonstrating the various aspects all newly released prisoners go through when exiting. Participants assume the identity of this former prisoner and have to walk in their shoes as they attempt to enter back into society. Location is to be announced and registration is necessary. Diane and Sue attended this 3 hour hands-on experience in December and found it to be very eye opening. Anyone can attend so watch for further information.
